Modernizing Our PCO System

While there are a few superstar Precinct Committee Officers (PCO's) in the world, I have the feeling most are like me - ineffective, hardly ever contacting their neighbors and feeling guilty about it. While we signed up to be PCO's to do something to change our state and our country, we can't seem to get motivated to do the job that is described in the PCO guidance. I think this is because we innately know what it's like to be on the other side of the door a PCO knocks on. We don't like some stranger interrupting our day trying to convince us how to vote. Why should I listen to this person?

With this in mind, instead of re-writing our PCO training manual again and again, trying harder to recruit more PCO's and trying to better organize them, I'd like to offer two thoughts:

1. I think that the current PCO system was created back when people had more contact with their physical neighbors. It made sense that the precincts and PCO's should be geographically oriented. But today, people's sphere of influence is quite different. We hardly know people who live more than one home away from ours. As a result, most PCO's typically do a terrible job of contacting their neighbors, because they are strangers. And we know strangers dropping flyers at our doors has no impact on our voting.

My actual sphere of influence is people at my church, folks I talk to at Costco and the gym, and my email and Facebook contacts. Therefore, I'm thinking PCO's should be targeting those groups of people, not geographically bounded, but people they actually know. Somebody I know and trust recommending a candidate really does have some impact. This would take a bit of brainstorming, but I think changing a PCO's "area" is an idea whose time has come.

2. Additionally, at a recent meeting, business owner Jim Rosemary, who has been in marketing for decades, talked a bit about different marketing strategies, and how they have changed over the years. We tend to use an old style he referred to as "interruption marketing". A billboard interrupting your view, or somebody ringing your doorbell interrupting your TV watching, is like that but has limited effectiveness. Why should I trust a billboard or a stranger at my door in deciding how to vote?

Modernizing Our PCO System - Continued

Something called “permission marketing” might be more effective. With permission marketing, the recipient wants and maybe even asks for what you are providing. Someone who is offering a service of something I need is much more likely to influence me positively than someone who is just trying to get me to agree with him. Because people know that I was in politics and trust me, I get a lot of phone calls and emails around election time asking me how to vote, especially on initiatives and non-partisan races. I don’t have to chase them down. They come to me. I have value in being a "resource" (of information) versus a "vendor" (trying to persuade or coerce customers to buy a product/vote a certain way).

In all my doorbelling as a State Representative, my objective was not to change anyone's opinion at their door. I just gave them my email and phone number to call if there was anything I could do for them, and was open to conversations on anything they wanted to talk about.

Again, this idea of “permission marketing” needs to be fleshed out. But instead of just revising our old marketing strategy again and again, a new marketing strategy could be much more effective in our state and across the country. We might actually get PCO's who like what they're doing and are more likely to do it.

Every month we highlight an individual who is helping to make a difference for the King County Republican Party. This month’s interview is with Hossein Khorram, longtime Republican volunteer, organizer and donor.

TEAM MEMBER INTERVIEW - CONTINUED

Interviewer: So, you help out with King County Republicans...

Hossein: Yes sir!

Interviewer: Please tell me a little bit about your background.

Hossein: OK, let me tell you about the present and then kind of go into the past. One of the biggest highlights of my life was serving as the Trump Victory Washington State Finance Co-Chair. I basically ran the Trump campaign in Washington State. It's an honor I do not take lightly. I served along with two members of congress and we raised a lot of money from the Northwest, about \$750,000.

Interviewer: That's awesome.

Hossein: And that's without the president ever coming here, that's all long-distance Trump support. There's a lot of love for the president here and I look forward to seeing Trump run in 2024 because I think he will get it this time. In addition, I've had the honor to serve on the King County Republican Party finance committee for close to 20 years. I was the chair of the committee under Chairman Cole, and Chairman Freed also picked me to lead. I'm very humbled and appreciate Chairman Freed's trust in me.

As far as KCGOP work I've been an activist for a little over twenty years and very involved in PCO work in the 48th. I had the honor to be a Huckabee alternate delegate to the Republican National Convention in 2008 and America's a great place, because if not how could you have a Muslim immigrant be on a Christian slate and go to the national convention? And that's how I did it.

Interviewer: That's great!

Hossein: Yeah, it just speaks volumes about who we are and what a great nation we live in. And then I was also a delegate to the Republican National Convention in 2012, 2016 and 2020.

I also serve as the Vice President for the American Mideast Coalition for Democracy which is a national organization of Middle Eastern Americans who have conservative values. The majority of us support President Trump. We had an advisory committee to the 2016 Trump campaign and I was the Chair of that committee and it was an honor. I'm just humbled by this great country that has opened so many gates for me to be able to serve, to show my gratitude.

TEAM MEMBER INTERVIEW - CONTINUED

Interviewer: That is so needed. I doorbelled many doors in the 47th district running for state house, and I saw immigrant family after immigrant family. And most of them think they're Democrat because that's the only messaging they've heard, and they don't realize the Republican party is the party of freedom and family values.

Hossein: Wow, exactly. And that's why we chose to come here, I want to go back in time and tell you how it happened when we came to the United States. I'd never set foot in the U.S. and I was a high school kid when the revolution happened in Iran and the Islamists took over. We're Muslims, and I want to define the Islamist as a group of strict persons who discriminate against other people regardless of religion based on their political ideology and they bring religion into this thing as a weapon. So they confiscated everything my family had based on our political views because my dad was a brave man, he disagreed with them.

And I'll never forget the day my dad told me, "Hossein, we're going to have to go to the United States." And I said, "Dad, we've never set foot in the States, we don't even know what language people speak in the United States, why there?" And he said, "Son, America is the land of the free and the brave. It's where people find their dreams. And whatever their dreams are, the higher the better, they can reach them in that country." And I'll just never forget that.

So we came here and I spoke just a few little words, but we adhered to the principles of free-market enterprise, and we worked very hard. If you're an immigrant and you have certain values - it's hard work, we're not here to take advantage of the social systems, we give and we don't take away - then you can come a long way from the suitcase you came with.

Today we're one of the more successful Bellevue developers involved in property management and we've done very well. That's how I became the chair for the KCGOP finance committee.

I'm glad that Chairman Freed has seen the value on reaching out to newcomers. In roughly about 20 to 25 years American is not going to be a majority white country anymore. And when we see who believes in the principles that we value so much, that our nation was built on - hard work, individual liberty and freedom - it doesn't matter whether they speak good English or not, or if they are newcomers...

Interviewer: Absolutely

TEAM MEMBER INTERVIEW - CONTINUED

Hossein: ...it should not matter, these are the people that we need to bring in if we're going to win it. That's fundamental for the GOP. Immigrants played a very good role toward the second half of Trump's presidency, because you don't need to convince them that Socialism is bad, they understand that freedom and free enterprise are the true goals of any man and woman, so they started to make that move and I hope the move will continue at the local level.

Interviewer: So shifting gears, what do you like to do for fun?

Hossein: [laughter] Today was my day off, I got up this morning and I saw the snow, and I just love the snow. So I went to work actually. My brother and I have a couple of properties and we just don't have the staff, the maintenance person was going to come in and called and said with the snow they can't come to work, and I said fine, I'm going to plow their driveways and all the sidewalks, I'm going to serve my residents. We did both properties. We take pride in work because that's who we are. We don't run away from work, we run to work. Work defines my character.

So what do I enjoy? I enjoy what feels good and work is probably on the top of that list. And the second thing is we do politics. Our country is really unique. America is so generous and so great. It's given newcomers like me sanctuary, when we had no country, when we were driven, when we were refugees. And it accepted us with open arms. I'll never forget we didn't have any money, I borrowed money through the student loan program but we didn't have a co-sign. The federal government co-signed for me, and it does for other people. But we gave it back, and way ahead of the schedule. And that's - if you're born in this country I understand, you know, you're a citizen, the federal government's going to sponsor you if you don't have financial means - but we were newcomers, we were immigrants, we were not even citizens. And America invested in us, trusted in us. And that's a trust that I never forget and it's my duty to pay back.

One of the things I also do is non-profit work. I was a past chairman for the USO Northwest, where we served roughly 800,000 of our active men and women in uniform among five USO centers. I put my heart and soul into this, and the board appointed me to be an emeritus board member and then it's chair.

And I just tell you, this is a great country. We don't discriminate like the Left accuses us Republicans of, that we're racist, that we have systemic racism and all those things, that's a bunch of lies. None of those things that BLM and people are accusing us of are true. All Americans love our country, we want to serve. They make ugly accusations for political gain and none of them are true with regards to racism. I'm so proud of my country and my President Trump, and I'm so disappointed with Biden and the Democrats.

TEAM MEMBER INTERVIEW - CONTINUED

Interviewer: So what are your hopes moving forward?

Hossein: I really want Trump to run again in 2024. I really do. I just feel that the Democrats really overplayed their hand, they basically took a noble document which is our Constitution and they turned it on its head for political purposes to try to prevent Trump from ever re-running for political office. They used every trick in the book from quarantining parts of Seattle, BLM, smears of racism, these are all fabricated things.

Interviewer: Trump has to be the cleanest president we've ever had. They've spent over five years investigating every facet of his life and he's come up clean. I don't know if that could even be said about many of the rank and file.

Hossein: [laughter] You know the thing is Trump is a businessman like me. I don't need anyone to fill my pocket for political gain. It's not what I do. I make my money in my real estate development business like Trump does, except Trump does it on a much bigger scale. I don't need these politicians. They need me. You know, for Trump to have benefitted from his presidency is absurd.

Interviewer: Absolutely, he took a step down to be president.

Hossein: Exactly! And these vultures - I call them vultures, creatures of the swamp - they're the ones who have been living off the back of the American people for decades. And they don't really have any skills, they've never written a paycheck, they don't create any jobs. What they do is just get things done behind the scenes - using the political power obtained on behalf of the American people - to enrich themselves and their families, and on top of that list is the Biden family.

Hunter Biden, and Biden himself, Kamala Harris, these guys are career politicians. Our Constitution was never meant to include career politicians. Our constitution was intended to have citizen politicians who volunteer to serve for a limited time to govern. And by having the citizens you would be able to connect to the talent, the desires and the hopes of many people. But these career politicians are truly removed from the constituency, they've become creatures of the swamp.

For one reason you're a newcomer, you need to establish yourself like we did. So get involved in politics, reach for your dreams, and say things as you see them. Do not be afraid. No one's going to try to shoot you down. You are only limited by your own ideas. If you don't limit yourself, no one's going to limit you from reaching for your dreams. That's what happened to me. And I'm so grateful to this great nation.

“Who can seriously doubt that the power which a millionaire, who may be my employer, has over me is very much less than that which the smallest bureaucrat possesses who wields the coercive power of the state, and on whose discretion...[it] depends how I am allowed to live and work?”

In every real sense a badly paid unskilled workman in this country has more freedom to shape his life than many an employer in Germany or a much better paid engineer or manager in Russia. If he wants to change his job or the place where he lives, if he wants to profess certain views or spend his leisure in a particular way, he faces no absolute impediments. There are no dangers to bodily security and freedom that confine him by brute force to the task and environment to which a superior has assigned him.

Our generation has forgotten that the system of private property is the most important guaranty of freedom. It is only because the control of the means of production is divided among many people acting independently that we as individuals can decide what to do with ourselves. When all the means of production are vested in a single hand, whether it be nominally that of ‘society’ as a whole or that of a dictator, whoever exercises this control has complete power over us. In the hands of private individuals, what is called economic power can be an instrument of coercion, but it is never control over the whole life of a person. Classical Thought – Composition and Minto: Being Persuasive

Composition: A Persuasive Essay

If you've ever considered writing a letter to the editor or a representative there are a couple of tricks of the trade which can make your letter more impactful. First is to use a basic composition form, the persuasive essay. It's easy to use and can practically write itself.

Begin by identifying the point you want to make. This is your "thesis". Come up with three supportive ideas of why your thesis is true or how it could work. You can have more or fewer supportive ideas but three is a good goal. Then, for each of your supportive ideas, think of three pieces of evidence for them.



Paragraph 1 -

The first paragraph goes from general to specific -

Start the first sentence general.

“Everyone...” “We are all...” etc.

The next sentence(s) introduce the topic and narrows the focus.

“But sometimes...” “And for many of us...” etc.

The final sentence states your thesis with its three supporting points.

“Doing < the thesis > would result in < supportive idea 1 >, < supportive idea 2 >, and < supportive idea 3 >.”

Paragraph 2 -

For supportive idea 1 write at least three sentences discussing the evidence for it.

“In order to accomplish < the thesis >, doing < supportive idea 1 > would result in < evidence 1 > ...”

“And < supportive idea 1 > would also help because of < evidence 2 > ...”

“Finally, if we do < supporting idea 1 > it will help by < evidence 3 >”

Paragraph 3 -

Do the same thing, at least three sentences of evidence for supportive idea 2.

Paragraph 4 -

Do the same thing with evidence for supportive idea 3.

Final paragraph -

The final paragraph goes back from specific to general -

First sentence restates your thesis with its three supportive ideas.

“As you can see, doing < the thesis > would clearly... < supportive idea 1 >, < supportive idea 2 >, < supportive idea 3 > ...”

Next sentence(s) work back out from your thesis.

“The next time...” “Those affected...” etc.

The final sentence should have worked back to general.

“All of us...” “Everyone...” etc.

Classical Thought – Composition and Minto: Being Persuasive - Continued

The Minto Pyramid Principle – Persuasive Thinking


This section is an optional read. It deals with a very complex analysis tool used in management called the Minto Pyramid Principle. The principle is that any problem can be broken down into logical, reasonable steps by analyzing the problem and its potential answers. Barbara Minto first came up with the idea in the 70's and it has become a classic tool for executives and project managers.

The Minto Pyramid is much more work than simply naming a solution to a problem, and sometimes it doesn't yield much better answers. But usually the process causes a person to consider pitfalls and options they hadn't considered beforehand, and it can lead to better propositions.

In a Minto analysis, you begin by identifying an action which needs to happen to something. In the language of a Minto analysis this is your "subject predicate". For example, a group of wild cats needs transport to a new home. In this case, "wild cats" is the subject and "transport to a new home" is the predicate, or action, which needs to happen to the subject.

Once you've identified the subject and the predicate (action), you need to identify the current situation and what complication(s) could block the action. This leads to a main question – how to make the action happen to the subject in light of the current situation & potential complications. Answering the main question produces the main answer, which can also be called the "Thesis".

The main answer can then be broken down further into lower questions- how to accomplish the various components of the answer, or (if proposing an idea) how to counter possible objections to the answer. Each of these lower questions can be answered with a recommendation in one of two ways – deduction (reasoning which takes a single problem and proposes multiple solutions, in order to find the best one[s]), or induction (reasoning that lumps together different potential problems and proposes a single solution for them).



Deduction – a single problem, multiple different possible solutions, find the right one


Induction – multiple different problems, try to group into a single solution

Note that if you are using inductive thinking to make a single recommendation which fixes multiple problems it is a good practice to identify what plural noun best describes the problems being addressed. This can help make the resulting recommendation more actionable and specific.

Classical Thought – Composition and Minto: Being Persuasive - Continued

Finally, after you've made recommendations you can list out reasons for each one of them.

What you wind up with will be something like this -



Here is an outline of a Minto Pyramid Analysis example:

Subject Predicate (action needing to happen to a subject):

Subject: Wild Cats

Predicate: Need a new home

Situation: The wild cats are all over!

Complication: No current way to contain them, no project owner

Main Question: How to contain and transport the cats to a new home, and who could do this?

Main Answer: Herd the cats into a container and assign an owner for transporting them

1. New question raised by answer: How do we herd cats?

a. Solve using Deductive logic or Inductive logic: Inductive

b. If Inductive, what is the plural noun: cats

c. Recommendation (the answer): We can put the cats all in Schrodinger's box

i. First reason for the recommendation: They should be safe in there for at least the duration of the trip
