FOREWORD - THE ANTI-SOCIALISM EDITION BY TED COOKE

This is the "anti-socialism" edition of the KCGOP newsletter. The theme of this newsletter began organically earlier this month as I was listening to Paul Kengor's excellent *The Politically Incorrect Guide to Communism*. The book describes in detail how dark of a force Marx's socialism has been on history, describing the hundreds of millions of victims of socialism in the past century including lives taken by their own governments and the taking of innocent lives in the womb through programs of forced abortion.

Hearing all of this I was concerned at how our leaders today are trying push though socialist programs of guaranteed basic income, arbitrarily shutting down what they think of as the private 40% of the economy, and trying to require papers or masks to be able to live a semi-normal life.

Violations of all ten articles of the Bill of Rights seem to have been occurring -

- From suspending freedom of assembly,

- To effectively quartering soldiers at our state and national legislative houses,
- To quarantining healthy people without a warrant,
- To depriving business owners and Capitol Hill residents of use of their property without due process of law,
- To quarantining of healthy people without public trial,
- To double jeopardy quarantining,
- To cruel and unusual infliction of hypoxia on school children,
- To misuse of the principle of general Welfare as an excuse to deny free religious exercise,
- To a state's executive assuming legislative powers not granted under any constitution.

As German Lutheran pastor Martin Niemöller wrote of the effects of National Socialism in Germany - and we face a similar militant National Socialism today from so called "Antifa" and BLM - when the German National Socialists targeted competing international socialists -

"First, they came for the socialists, and I did not speak out—
Because I was not a socialist.

Then they came for the trade unionists, and I did not speak out—
Because I was not a trade unionist.

Then they came for the Jews, and I did not speak out—
Because I was not a Jew.

Then they came for me—and there was no one left to speak for me."

The Right's Social Justice

Christian Social Justice is based on blending the truths of Jesus Christ and the Bible with private and public efforts toward helping people. Those in need include prisoners, widows, orphans, and others in need of assistance- whether temporary or permanent.

Christian social justice involves human development: Material help goes hand-in-hand with reformation of the heart, mind, and soul. A person integrates back into the larger society. Faith and family is critical. Christian Social Justice is meant to bring folks back to Jesus Christ, virtue, and responsibility.

Christian social justice outreaches include law and order, criminal justice and rehabilitation, just wages, promotion of marriage and family, mental health care, and affordable housing. They also include substance and alcohol abuse programs which are accountable, and work to eliminate addiction.

In recent years, the term "social justice" has been corrupted. The secular version of helping the vulnerable and those in need has been redefined, based on feelings and neo-pagan values. Today's social justice promotes sin and enablement, while rejecting faith in God. It does not recognize sin, redemption, personal improvement, and integration back into society, community, and family.

In order for Christian social justice to be effective, a nation must be based on the Judeo-Christian concept of objective truth. But today, we see "help" being given based on "feelings," in a society of secular or pagan values. Many of today's programs have lost sight of the two-fold goal of ending peoples' addictions and training them to enter the job market.

A couple of wonderful, modern-day examples of Christian social justice are the Union Gospel Mission and Salvation Army. Their programs promote faith, family, marriage, healthy values, respect for private property rights, and virtue, while at the same time discouraging vice and sin.

Christian social justice, done right, would eliminate much of the homeless problem in our region. It would truly help people get out of the cycle of addiction and poverty. It would bring the "tough love" which many vulnerable people around us need in order to be set free from their addiction. Christian social justice would provide true love and help for people in need.

The Left's Social Justice

I have been asked to discuss the differences between equality of liberty under Judeo Christian values vs. the Leftist Social Justice value of equity: equality of outcomes. I want to compare two fictional people:

John Doe:

As a recent college graduate, in a truly socialist country, our John Doe has graduated from Social Justice University. Like all of his peers, he has no student loan debt, and has been granted a job paying him \$60,000 a year. He comes and goes as he pleases, because his job cannot be taken away from him. He started out strong, coming in every day, making sure to do his work, but eventually he started slacking, after all, he got paid if he worked or not. Eventually, he reduced his hours, but made sure to come in on occasion. Let us contrast John Doe with John The Doer.

John The Doer:

John The Doer graduated from Judeo Christian University. He worked all through his degree, and was fortunate to graduate with only \$30,000 of student loan debt. It took a few months, but he finally landed a non-government sponsored job for \$40,000 a year. It was hard work, and his employers demanded a lot from him, but the company really seemed to be going somewhere.

Who is better off?

On the surface, John Doe seems to have the better deal, he has no debt, and a better paying job. The progressive left would have you believe that this is where the story ends, but this is only the beginning. Let us fast-forward 5 years.

John Doe still has his government-sponsored job. He is now at \$65,000 a year, and qualified for government housing, so he has a government-approved apartment which is included in his salary. It is small, 2 bedrooms, 1 bathroom. But it is just him and his girlfriend, so it works fine.

John The Doer has been working hard to pay off his student loans and save for a down-payment on a house. He has received a promotion at work, along with a raise. He now makes \$50,000 a year, has \$10,000 left on his student loans, and has \$15,000 saved for a down payment on a home.

Let us see what another 5 years brings: John Doe is now making \$70,000 a year, but has not received a promotion. He was told that it is not fair to promote people, as that would lead to an unfair outcome. He married his girlfriend, and they now have 2 children.

The two-bedroom apartment is too small now, but he does not qualify for anything larger because that would be "unfair". After all, the goal is that everyone receives the same outcome, and a two-bedroom apartment has been decided as adequate for everyone. He also requested a transfer to be closer to family, but that was denied as well. There were no available positions in the requested city. He thought about starting his own business, but since he is in a government guaranteed job, he is not allowed to make more per year than his annual salary. Any profits from the business would be taxed at 100%. After all, it is not fair if he earns more money than those around him.

John The Doer is a different story. After several successful years at his first job, he and his wife decided to move to a different state to be closer to family. He landed a great job with a large pay-raise (\$90,000 a year). He was able to buy a house that, although was a little large at the time, at 4 bedrooms, he knew they wanted a family. Two kids later, they are very happy with their choices.

How does the story end?

Years down the road, they retired. John Doe worked his whole life in a government job. He had guaranteed schooling, guaranteed job, guaranteed housing, but with no promotions, no growth, no raises beyond the annual cost-of-living raise. He still has his same two-bedroom apartment. He has no savings and is now entirely dependent on the government for his retirement. Every choice has been made for him by the government.

John The Doer has a retirement, a large house that is paid for, which is worth much more now than when he bought it. He started out with no guarantees but was able to make something of himself.

What went wrong for John Doe?

There are several major problems with this little story. I am assuming that John Doe, in his guaranteed government job, is able to continue to hold his job his whole life. This is a major assumption. Socialist countries, historically, do not run their companies well. With no one working hard, there is little produced, which means no real profits for the company, so the company has to rely on the government to pay its salaries for it. Eventually, the socialist country runs out of money. Another major problem is that basic life necessities become scarce in socialist countries. Things like toilet paper, bread, milk, and butter are hard to come by.

Equality of outcome is an attractive idea. Everyone succeeds. Everyone "makes it". No one is "rich". It sounds so fair, until you stop to think about it more. Are you going to be assigned a YouTube channel to watch so everyone has the same subscribers and the same views, and therefore, the same income?

Or do we just stop paying YouTubers altogether? What if you are a world-class Basketball Player? Or a world-famous author? Is it fair for you to be taxed so much you only make \$70,000 a year? Let us flip this around. Is it fair for John Doe to decide he no longer wants to go to work, so he stays home all day playing video games and still makes his annual salary?

What went right for John The Doer?

The idea of equality of liberty and equal treatment under the law is nothing new. It is what we strove for in the Civil War, where we wanted all men free. It is what we strove for in the Civil Rights Movement, where we wanted everyone to have the same access to jobs, education, and stores.

What's the bottom line?

If you break the law, there should be the same consequence no matter who you are, who you know, or what color your skin is. That is a big contrast to how the law is handled under "equity". Were you arrested for an approved "peaceful" protest? (The kind where stores are looted and burned down.) Slap on the hand. Were you arrested for protesting the government's overreach? (The very dangerous kind of protest where everyone is standing peacefully, and goes home without breaking anything or yelling at anyone.) Jail Time.

The Left's "Equity" has never been about true equality of outcome, it is about punishing those who disagree, and buying the votes of everyone else.

TEAM MEMBER INTERVIEW - MARK MILOSCIA

Mark Miloscia is the Executive Director of the Family Policy Institute of Washington. He served King & Pierce County's 30th Legislative District as a "blue dog" Democrat State Representative from 1999-2013 before separating from their party over family & life issues, and then moved on to serve as a Republican State Senator from 2014-2018, representing the people of Algona, Auburn, Des Moines, Federal Way, Milton and Pacific.

Interviewer: Mark you've had a significant impact on things which happen in King County politics, and I'm very appreciative of that. Please tell me a little bit about your background.

Mark: Well, I entered the Air Force Academy in the mid-70s and graduated there in 1980 and the same day married my wife Meschell. In fact, tomorrow will be our 41st wedding anniversary! And from there I went and flew a B-52 bombers for a number of years. They sent me to be stationed here in the Northwest at McCord Air Force Base where I worked at Boeing as an Air Force contract manager. And that's how I came to King County and to Federal Way. From there I got involved in my local community and got involved in politics.

Believe it or not I started out as a Democrat, back when a pro-life, pro-family person could be a member of the Democrat party. Since then, as everyone knows, the Democratic party has gone radically to the Left and I ended up getting effectively kicked out of it about ten years ago. So, I ran again after serving 14 years as a Democrat state rep and I became a Republican state senator.

I ended up losing my state senate race two years ago and I found my calling and vocation working at the Family Policy Institute of Washington, which I am doing right now.

Interviewer: What is your current role there?

Mark: I am the executive director. We are a Christian public policy organization where we represent Christians - and people of any faith - trying to work on the issues of family, marriage, life and Christian social justice. Which means making sure we have effective human services programs like- how do we effectively deal with people who are homeless? Or are addicted to drugs? And effectively it's a lot of the same public polices I worked on as a state senator.

Interviewer: So, what would people say are some of your talents?

Mark: Oh, well, my motto as an elected official was: Straight talk, no nonsense. I think it's being direct with people, whether it's the voters or the people I serve here in this job. What I strive to achieve is: Try to be bold. Try to tell people the truth about what's going on. And try to work together with people to get the solutions we need to serve the common good. And - in my case - to try to serve Jesus Christ.

Interviewer: That's awesome. So, when you're not busy doing that, what are some things you like to do for fun?

Mark: Oh, things I like to do for fun? Well, I happen to be an avid book reader. I enjoy reading, and when I'm not doing that, I like to actively serve in my church here in Federal Way, at St. Vincent de Paul Parish. And of course, I enjoy being with my family, and traveling like we are here, right now, to Hawaii. We were actually going to go last year for our 40th wedding anniversary, but then the entire covid thing broke out.

Interviewer: So, what are your hopes for the future?

Mark: We live in very divisive times right now. What I'm trying to achieve, my hope for the future, is that people of goodwill - Christians, social conservatives, people that want to see our state and community succeed - will get more involved. And will try to work together to bring back what made America great. America was founded on some great principles - a Judeo Christian philosophy and values. Right now, we're losing that, and so goes our country and true prosperity. We have to go back to the principles of freedom, hard work, service, sacrifice, virtue, faith and family. What I hope to achieve is that we start representing, and push back against this ugly culture that seems to be dominating and taking over Federal Way where I live, and King County, and much of our state.

Right now, violence is on the rise, so is anger, and almost a societal madness. We've almost lost control of our schools, and all of our entertainment and cultural institutions. So now is the time for people of goodwill to get involved in what is happening in their community. And speak the truth about their values and how best to live together and truly succeed as a free state. Now is not the time to remain silent while there is this ugliness that is spreading across Washington State and America.

Interviewer: Well, both KCGOP and the Family Policy Institute of Washington are great places for people to find opportunities, to get information and to really get active.

Mark: I couldn't say it better myself. Our organization is encouraging folks to get involved by: Running for their local school board, by becoming a PCO, helping out those in need, and being a voice for what is right and just in society. We are encouraging everyone right now, it's part of our mission, now is not the time for people of goodwill to remain silent or inactive.

Interviewer: So, if you had to boil it down, what is your message for others?

Mark: My message for others is that there is great hope for our future. America is a fantastic country. Washington State - now over 100 years old - is a fantastic state to live in. This coming darkness that we see happening here in King County can be pushed back, it can be defeated when all of us are involved.

Classical Thought – Hume’s Gap and Fatal Conceit

In the May issue of the KCGOP Newsletter, Volume 1 Issue 5, I wrote about Hume’s Gap which says that we cannot derive values from facts alone, we can only derive other facts from facts. Values are separate from facts and depending on one’s values a fact can be positive or negative. If a person values outcomes of individual freedom and prosperity then Judeo Christian morality is demonstrably the best value system in the history of the world.

It’s interesting that in the past 140 years one of the primary strategies of Leftists and Progressives has been to criticize Judeo Christian morality using the false claim that it results in poverty, inequality, totalitarianism, war and death. This is ironic because it is a Judeo Christian world view in the first place which values personal industry, equality, liberty, peace and life. They are using Judeo Christian morality which they themselves reject in order to condemn Judeo Christian morality.

Regarding the morality & world view of socialism here are some quotes by past leaders in the socialist movement. For the purposes of these quotes both Communism and Humanism will accurately be classified as falling under the banner of socialism -

Here is Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels in Communist Manifesto 1, 1848, explaining that socialism purposely breaks with all existing ideas of morality:

“...[A bourgeois objection to Communism is that] ‘There are, besides, eternal truths, such as Freedom, Justice, etc., that are common to all states of society. But Communism abolishes eternal truths, it abolishes all religion, and all morality, instead of constituting them on a new basis; it therefore acts in contradiction to all past historical experience.’ What does this accusation reduce itself to? The history of all past society has consisted in the development of class antagonisms, antagonisms that assumed different forms at different epochs. But whatever form they may have taken, one fact is common to all past ages, viz., the exploitation of one part of society by the other. No wonder, then, that the social consciousness of past ages, despite all the multiplicity and variety it displays, moves within certain common forms, or general ideas, which cannot completely vanish except with the total disappearance of class antagonisms. The Communist revolution is the most radical rupture with traditional property relations; no wonder that its development involved the most radical rupture with traditional ideas...”

Here is an unproven quote attributed to Vladimir Lenin in 1920 which does a great job of distilling what he explains at length in his printed works, belief that all ideas of morality are completely subject to the ideas found in class warfare:

“We repudiate all morality that proceeds from supernatural ideas or ideas that are outside class conceptions. Morality is entirely subordinate to the interests of class war. Everything is moral that is necessary for the annihilation of the old exploiting social order and for uniting the proletariat.”

Here is Roy Wood Sellers and Raymond Bragg in Humanist Manifest 1, 1933, arguing that morality - along with all human associations and institutions - is subject to transformation, control and direction by socialist leaders. This document was signed by John Dewey, the undisputed architect of the modern U.S. school system, and by no fewer than eleven other academic leaders including professors from the philosophy departments of Cornell, Columbia, U-Pitt, U-Chicago and U-Michigan:

Classical Thought – Hume’s Gap and Fatal Conceit

“Humanism asserts that the nature of the universe depicted by modern science makes unacceptable any supernatural or cosmic guarantees of human values....In the place of the old attitudes involved in worship and prayer the humanist finds his religious emotions expressed in a heightened sense of personal life and in a cooperative effort to promote social well-being... humanism maintains that all associations and institutions exist for the fulfillment of human life. The intelligent evaluation, transformation, control, and direction of such associations and institutions with a view to the enhancement of human life is the purpose and program of humanism.”

Here is Saul Alinsky in his book *Rules for Radicals*, 1971, explaining that ultimately there is no objective morality and that people must be made hopeless or passive in order to submit to socialist change:

[Page xxi] “Men don’t like to step abruptly out of the security of familiar experience; they need a bridge to cross from their own experience to a new way. A revolutionary organizer must shake up the prevailing patterns of their lives- agitate, create disenchantment and discontent with the current values, to produce, if not a passion for change, at least a passive, affirmative, non-challenging climate.”

[Page 12] “Political realists see the world as it is: an arena of power politics moved primarily by perceived immediate self-interests, where morality is rhetorical rationale for expedient action and self-interest.”

[Page 15] “We then recognize that for every positive there is a negative, and that there is nothing positive without its concomitant negative, nor any political paradise without its negative side.”

[Page 17] “The grasp of the duality of all phenomena is vital in our understanding of politics. It frees one from the myth that one approach is positive and another negative. There is no such thing in life. One man’s positive is another man’s negative.”

At the heart of all of these quotes on morality for socialist leaders is the assumption that - to borrow the words of Ronald Reagan - “a little intellectual elite in a far-distant capitol can plan our lives for us better than we can plan them ourselves.” (*The Speech*, 1964).

There is a fundamental misunderstanding on the part of modern socialists which thinks that knowledge and ability on the part of leaders is the same as moral permission and imperative. They believe that they themselves can and should engineer all of reality in an attempt to achieve a socialist utopia. From mRNA gene therapy and frozen embryos to the now ongoing release of millions of genetically modified mosquitoes in Florida. The great Austrian School of Economics professor F. A. Hayek - ironically an atheist - described such thinking in his book *The Fatal Conceit*. He argues that western morality and the principles of life, liberty and property are endowed by culture’s long search for what will work best, and that “rationalist” attempts to destroy and reengineer these values are in truth irrational and destructive:

“The influence of rationalism has indeed been so profound and pervasive that, in general, the more intelligent an educated person is, the more likely he or she now is not only to be a rationalist, but also to hold socialist views (regardless of whether he or she is sufficiently doctrinal to attach to his or her views any label, including ‘socialist’). The higher we climb up the ladder of intelligence, the more we talk with intellectuals, the more likely we are to encounter socialist convictions. Rationalists tend to be intelligent and intellectual; and intelligent intellectuals tend to be socialist.

Classical Thought – Hume’s Gap and Fatal Conceit

One’s initial surprise at finding that intelligent people tend to be socialist diminishes when one realises that, of course, intelligent people will tend to overvalue intelligence, and to suppose that we must owe all the advantages and opportunities that our civilisation offers to deliberate design rather than to following traditional rules, and likewise to suppose that we can, by exercising our reason, eliminate any remaining undesired features by still more intelligence reflection, and still more appropriate design and ‘rational coordination’ of our undertakings. This leads one to be favorably disposed to the central economic planning and control that lie at the heart of socialism...

And since they have been taught that constructivism and scientism are what science and the use of reason are all about, they find it hard to believe that there can exist any useful knowledge that did not originate in deliberate experimentation, or to accept the validity of any tradition apart from their own tradition of reason. Thus [they say]: ‘Tradition is almost by definition reprehensible, something to be mocked and deplored’.”

Hayek then referred to Adam Smith’s “invisible hand” example to explain how centralized control over economies, social institutions and popular thought always leads to poverty and servitude.

“To understand our civilisation, one must appreciate that the extended order resulted not from human design or intention but spontaneously: it arose from unintentionally conforming to certain traditional and largely moral practices, many of which men tend to dislike, whose significance they usually fail to understand, whose validity they cannot prove, and which have nonetheless fairly rapidly spread by means of an evolutionary selection the comparative increase of population and wealth of those groups that happened to follow them....The creation of wealth is not simply a physical process and cannot be explained by a chain of cause and effect. It is determined not by objective physical facts known to any one mind but by the separate, differing information of millions, which is precipitated in prices that serve to guide further decisions.”

When socialists try to abandon Judeo Christian values they must reduce and then eliminate individual liberty and property. And having eliminated these, it’s a small step to eliminating individuals’ lives in what they believe is a transition to a utopia. The transition always results in literal hell on earth. The desired utopia can’t exist because it goes against natural law (human selfishness) and because of the limitations of individual human intelligence and resulting insurmountable limitation of machine algorithms.

Could Have Been Written Today

Question: Now, if I understand you, the workers in this country [America] look up to the [leading socialist country] as their country, is that right?

Answer: The more advanced workers do.

Question: Look upon the [leading socialist country] as their country?

Answer: Yes

Question: Look upon the [red flag] as their flag?

Answer: The workers of this country and the workers of every country have only one flag and that is the red flag. That is the flag of proletarian revolution.

Question: Well, the workers of this country consider, then the [leading socialist country] to be their country. Do they also consider the red flag to be their flag?

Answer: I have answered quite clearly.

Question: Do you owe allegiance to the American flag? Does the Communist Party owe allegiance to the American flag?

Answer: The workers, the revolutionary workers, in all the capitalist countries are an oppressed class who are held in subjection by their respective capitalist governments and their attitude toward these governments is the abolition of these governments and the establishment of [socialist] governments.

Question: Well, they do not claim any allegiance, then, to the American flag in this country?

Answer: That is, you mean, the support of capitalism in America? No.

Question: I mean if they had to choose between the red flag and the American flag, I take it from you that you would chose the red flag, is that correct?

Answer: I have stated my answer.

Question: I do not want to force you to answer if it embarrasses you...

Answer: It does not embarrass me at all. I stated very clearly the red flag is the flag of the revolutionary class, and we are part of the revolutionary class.

Could Have Been Written Today - Continued

Question: I understood that.

Answer: And all capitalist flags are flags of the capitalist class, and we owe no allegiance to them.

Question: Well that answers the question....

Question: Have you been to [the leading socialist country]?

Answer: Yes. Eight or nine times....

Question: Do the Communists in this country advocate revolution?

Answer: Yes. The Communists in this country realize that America is connected up with the whole world system, and the capitalist system displays the same characteristics everywhere. Everywhere it makes for the misery and the exploitation of workers. And it must be abolished, not only on an American scale but on a world scale.

Question: So that they do advocate world revolution? And do they advocate revolution in this country?

Answer: I have stated that the Communists advocate the abolition of the capitalist system in this country and every other country. That this must develop out of the sharpening of the class struggle and the struggle of the workers for bread and butter....

Question: Now are the communists in this country opposed to our republican form of government?

Answer: The capitalist democracy? Most assuredly. We stand for a workers' and farmers' government. A government of producers, not a government of exploiters. The American capitalist Government is built and controlled in the interests of those who own the industries, and we say that the Government must be built and controlled by those who work in the industries who produce.

Question: They are opposed to our republican form of government?

Answer: Most assuredly.

Could Have Been Written Today

Question: And they desire to overthrow it through revolutionary methods?

Answer: I would like to read from the program of the Communist International at this point. The Communist International program says... [At this point in testimony pauses to read from the Comintern document] 'The conquest of power by the proletariat does not mean peaceful capturing of ready-made bourgeois state machinery by means of a parliamentary majority.

The bourgeoisie resorts to every means of violence and terror to safeguard and strengthen its predatory property and political domination. Like the feudal nobility of the past, the bourgeoisie cannot abandon its historical position to the new class without a desperate and frantic struggle; hence the violence of the bourgeoisie can only be suppressed by the stern violence of the proletariat.'

Testimony of former head of the Communist Party USA (CPUSA), William Z. Foster, 1930. From The Politically Incorrect Guide to Communism by Paul Kengor, PhD.
