MADE IN CHINA BOOK REVIEW

Imagine a country where millions of people are imprisoned without formal charges or any sort of trial in forced labor camps where they are cut off from the rest of the world. They are fed little to nothing, beaten, tortured, politically indoctrinated, deprived of sleep, and denied medical care. Compelled to work in factories 15-20 hours a day 7 days a week without pay, they can be killed to harvest their organs- -all because of their religion.

Now tell the truth. Did you think I was talking about Nazi Germany? Stalinist Russia? Or maybe a post-apocalyptic horror movie?

What if I tell you this is a true story and that you personally own thousands of the goods these victims manufactured? Look around you. Unless you are an American with extremely unusual shopping habits, up to 80% of your clothes and linens, cell phone and computer, dishes, home furnishings and appliances, fans and air conditioners, glasses, children's toys and sporting goods, school and office supplies, medicines, face masks, car parts, tools, jewelry, and much more are made in China by the very slaves described above.

I began to learn the heart-rending details of this real-life horror story when I picked up investigative reporter and journalist Amelia Pang's 2021 book *Made in China: A Prisoner, an SOS letter, and the Hidden Cost of America's Cheap Goods*. Like you are, I was previously aware that China has long persecuted its religious minorities- Muslim Uyghurs, Christians, followers of the Dalai Lama, and Falun Gong practitioners. Yet the shameful truth of our own complicity as American consumers in this modern slavery is the gut-punching center of this book. To this day, the complete story is still being revealed by brave journalists, Chinese dissidents, and various modern anti-slavery, human rights groups. Some international pressure has inspired President Xi's government to officially "close" many of the re-education camps. Yet the slaves still remain imprisoned as they work in the same factories in the same conditions with the same guards, producing the same goods, just with a new sign over the front gates of these "Detox Centers" or "Pre-trial Detention Centers."

Pang's book begins with an Oregon mother named Julie Keith who in 2012 accidentally uncovered an SOS letter in a box of cheap Halloween decorations made by a slave in one of these factories, a Falun Gong member named Sun Yi. Keith decided to track down this prisoner to make sure he was alive and free.

The book is her story, the story of Sun Yi and several other prisoners, and the author's personal research journeys into China to uncover the truth. It reads like a contemporary true-crime thriller, is rigorously researched, and well-documented. The author makes several statements on environmental policy that you and I may disagree with, but this is a book no freedom-loving American should ignore.

Personally, the book gave me nightmares and compelled me to search in more depth for how to know which Chinese goods could truly be considered slavery-free, but what I discovered is similar to Pang's conclusion. The Chinese government has become incredibly adept at disguising which products are made in the prison camps by trucking products from place to place to avoid inspectors, so that often perhaps only one tiny part is made by waged employees in a real factory. That factory can then certify the entire product as "slave-free" when the truth is far from it. In other situations, and with clothing in particular, the cotton is grown, harvested, dyed, and processed by Uyghur slaves before it is sold to India or other regional trade partners to be sewn and sold as "made in _____ (somewhere other than China)." The only way to avoid fueling this blood-soaked supply chain is to never buy anything with any parts grown or made in China. Period.

We Republicans are the party of "abolition," as the word was originally intended. We claim to oppose slavery and value freedom as basic moral imperatives. Yet as long as we continue to buy items made in Communist China, the Chinese will find a way to use slaves to produce them. Now is the time to put our money and time where our mouth is. We should fight Chinese (and global) slavery and genocide through social media, educating our friends and family, boycotts, contacting government officials and companies we buy from, protesting, and any other legal means we can imagine. This is not an easy path, but the path of radical love of our neighbors rarely is. As the late Elie Wiesel, famous Holocaust survivor and author, used to say "The opposite of love is not hate; it's indifference."

- PAIGE THIBAUT

Paige: My assessment of where we are at right now is that Joshua is doing amazing things in King County. He's really activated the Republican Party, he's recruited a lot of new PCOs and done great things in terms of fundraising. So I'm really encouraged by all of that and by the primary this past month. My hopes for the future are that the team can continue to activate Republicans in King County and get out the Republican message and cause. And help get some Republicans elected officials into office in the next year or two.

Interviewer: What would you consider to be your message for others:

Paige: My message for others is the importance of getting involved in whatever way you can, whatever that looks like. COULD HAVE BEEN WRITTEN TODAY

“In one way we think a great deal too much of the atomic bomb. ‘How are we to live in an atomic age?’ I am tempted to reply: ‘Why, as you would have lived in the sixteenth century when the plague visited London almost every year, or as you would have lived in a Viking age when raiders from Scandinavia might land and cut your throat any night; or indeed, as you are already living in an age of cancer, an age of syphilis, an age of paralysis, an age of air raids, an age of railway accidents, an age of motor accidents.’

In other words, do not let us begin by exaggerating the novelty of our situation. Believe me, dear sir or madam, you and all whom you love were already sentenced to death before the atomic bomb was invented: and quite a high percentage of us were going to die in unpleasant ways. We had, indeed, one very great advantage over our ancestors—anesthetics; but we have that still. It is perfectly ridiculous to go about whimpering and drawing long faces because the scientists have added one more chance of painful and premature death to a world which already bristled with such chances and in which death itself was not a chance at all, but a certainty.

This is the first point to be made: and the first action to be taken is to pull ourselves together. If we are all going to be destroyed by an atomic bomb, let that bomb when it comes find us doing sensible and human things—praying, working, teaching, reading, listening to music, bathing the children, playing tennis, chatting to our friends over a pint and a game of darts—not huddled together like frightened sheep and thinking about bombs. They may break our bodies but they need not dominate our minds.”

The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us -- that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion -- that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain -- that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom -- and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth."

“The Battle of France is over: the Battle of Britain is about to begin. Upon this battle depends the survival of Christian civilisation. Upon it depends our own British life, and the long continuity of our institutions and our Empire. The whole fury and might of the enemy must very soon be turned on us. Hitler knows that he will have to break us in this island or lose the war. If we can stand up to him, all Europe may be freed and the life of the world may move forward into broad, sunlit uplands. But if we fail, then the whole world, including the United States, including all that we have known and cared for, will sink into the abyss of a new Dark Age made more sinister, and perhaps more protracted, by the lights of perverted science. Let us therefore brace ourselves to our duty and so bear ourselves that, if the British Empire and its Commonwealth last for a thousand years, men will still say: This was their finest hour.”

-Sir Winston Churchill, Address to the House of Commons, June 18th, 1940

“But for everyone, surely, what we have gone through in this period--I am addressing myself to the School--surely from this period of ten months, this is the lesson: Never give in. Never give in. Never, never, never, never--in nothing, great or small, large or petty--never give in, except to convictions of honour and good sense. Never yield to force. Never yield to the apparently overwhelming might of the enemy. We stood all alone a year ago, and to many countries it seemed that our account was closed, we were finished. All this tradition of ours, our songs, our School history, this part of the history of this country, were gone and finished and liquidated. Very different is the mood today. Britain, other nations thought, had drawn a sponge across her slate. But instead our country stood in the gap. There was no flinching and no thought of giving in; and by what seemed almost a miracle to those outside these Islands, though we ourselves never doubted it, we now find ourselves in a position where I say that we can be sure that we have only to persevere to conquer. You sang here a verse of a School Song: you sang that extra verse written in my honour, which I was very greatly complimented by and which you have repeated today. But there is one word in it I want to alter - I wanted to do so last year, but I did not venture to. It is the line: ‘Not less we praise in darker days.’ I have obtained the Head Master's permission to alter darker to sterner. ‘Not less we praise in sterner days.’ Do not let us speak of darker days: let us speak rather of sterner days. These are not dark days; these are great days--the greatest days our country has ever lived; and we must all thank God that we have been allowed, each of us according to our stations, to play a part in making these days memorable.”
